CERT Looking for Volunteers

Mt. Angel Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a well organized volunteer group designed to augment the local responders by assisting in many vital duties so that the professional agencies may perform their main jobs. Volunteers are trained in basic fire prevention, light search and rescue, debris removal, First Aid and CPR, medical assistance, evacuation, and triage, as well as emergency operations. The Mt. Angel CERT usually meets once a month in the evening, so it is not very time consuming to belong.
