

Historical Society to Use the Saalfeld Family House

Earlier this month, the City Council approved an agreement with the Mount Angel Historical Society which will enable the Society to use the Saalfeld Family House for its purposes. As work continues to be done to improve the grounds of the Saalfeld Family Park, earlier this year the City Council turned attention to what to do with the house. After several months of exchanging ideas and discussing needs, an agreement was forged with the Society to use the house for storing the Society's collection of historical materials and for meetings. The house will not be operated as a museum or opened for public use, but the City and the Society are pleased to partner in seeing the house in use once again!



Clean up Before Oktoberfest!

With all of the summer sun, plants near property lines have a tendency to crowd nearby sidewalks and weeds pop up making sidewalks, driveways, parking areas and other "common" spaces look unsightly or hard to pass by. The Mt. Angel City Code requires property owners to maintain the sidewalk in front of their property to keep it clear of bushes and other debris.

Please also take advantage of Clean Up Day on September 6th from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Republic Services will once again have dumpsters available at the Legion Hall parking lot for yard debris, wood and metal

materials. Acceptable yard debris includes shrubs, grass clippings, tree or shrub trunks no larger than 6" diameter. Wood must be clean (unpainted and unvarnished.) Acceptable metal includes major appliances, steel, aluminum, bike and bed frames, wire fencing and e-cycling including TV's, computer monitors and towers. Now is a great time to spruce up your place before Oktoberfest and help make Mt. Angel beautiful as we again showcase our city!
