Medical Marijuana in Mt. Angel

A Town Hall meeting was held on February 24th on medical marijuana regulation in Mt. Angel. At the meeting, Mayor Otte spoke about marijuana regulation in Oregon and then answered questions. The purpose of the meeting was to provide input to the Planning Commission, and ultimately the City Council, before allowing medical marijuana dispensaries in Mt. Angel.

If you weren't able to make it to the Town Hall, the Planning Commission will also conduct a public hearing on this topic on March 5th at 7 p.m. in the Library Community Room. The City Council will then consider the Planning Commission's recommendations on a medical marijuana zoning ordinance on March 30th.

In order to be able to reserve a park we need a completed application, which you can obtain from the City of Mt. Angel website or pick one up at City Hall, the required fee (\$25 for residents/\$40 for non-residents and \$25 cleaning deposit), a Certificate of Liability Insurance, and if there will be alcohol at your event you will also need an alcohol permit (\$25).
